The Third Scripture Lesson

³⁶ When one of the Pharisees invited Jesus to have dinner with him, he went to the Pharisee's house and reclined at the table. ³⁷ A woman in that town who lived a sinful life learned that Jesus was eating at the Pharisee's house, so she came there with an alabaster jar of perfume. ³⁸ As she stood behind him at his feet weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears. Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them and poured perfume on them. ³⁹ When the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would know who is touching him and what kind of woman she is—that she is a sinner." ⁴⁰ Jesus answered him, "Simon, I have something to tell you." "Tell me, teacher," he said. ⁴¹ "Two people owed money to a certain moneylender. One owed him five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. ⁴² Neither of them had the money to pay him back, so he forgave the debts of both. Now which of them will love him more?" ⁴³ Simon replied, "I suppose the one who had the bigger debt forgiven." "You have judged correctly," Jesus said. ⁴⁴ Then he turned toward the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I came into your house. You did not give me any water for my feet, but she wet my feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair. ⁴⁵ You did not give me a kiss, but this woman, from the time I entered, has not stopped kissing my feet. ⁴⁶ You did not put oil on my head, but she has poured perfume on my feet. ⁴⁷ Therefore, I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven—as her great love has shown. But whoever has been forgiven little loves little." ⁴⁸ Then Jesus said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." ⁴⁹ The other guests began to say among themselves, "Who is this who even forgives sins?" ⁵⁰ Jesus said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace."

Our goal is that the lives of our team members, our congregation, and also the Costa Ricans with whom we will form relationships will be transformed through the power of the gospel. We will go to Costa Rica as learners and servants, to assist our missionaries as they work alongside the Costa Rican church to make God known by establishing a presbytery in Costa Rica and planting reformed, gospel-centered churches all over Costa Rica and beyond.



You can help us! As we work hard at preparing over the next three and a half months through prayer, Bible study, research, language learning, and reading, *you can come along side us and send us out with prayer, encouragement and financial support!* Did you know that it will cost almost \$14,000 to send our team of eleven people to Costa Rica for eight days? **We are asking that Seminole Church contribute one third of this cost (roughly \$4,500).** *Are you with us?* Stay tuned and we will be providing information on some upcoming fundraising opportunities that will help us reach this goal.

As we seek to represent Christ's Church at Seminole, your prayers and financial support are essential for this trip.

First Hug is a program established by Metropolitan Ministries that seeks to stabilize and strengthen homeless families with young children in our immediate community. To make this program a success, *MetMin is looking for members of our church to assist in the First Hug program.* There are three different ways we can help out with this program:



1. **First Responder** – a First Responder will connect with First Hug families for visitation, prayer, and emotional support. This is a short-term commitment, generally 30 -60 days.
2. **Family Mentor** – a Family Mentor provides a minimum 2-year commitment, offering support in specific areas of need (money management, parenting, tutoring, etc.), connecting the family to church programs, and visiting with the family.
3. **Parent-Child Home Program** – this is a literacy-school preparedness program for families with 2 & 3 year old children. Volunteers in this program will visit the child in his/her home two times a week for ½ hour, bringing a toy or a book each time. The program runs for two 23-week cycles over the course of two years.

**Specific program training is provided for each of these different areas.
Training and background screening are mandatory for participation
in any area of the First Hug program.**

The next training is coming up on Saturday, April 13 from 9 am – 12 pm (location TBA). The First Hug program is a great way to employ the skills God has blessed each one of us with in assisting a struggling family to regain self-sufficiency. **Please prayerfully consider how you may participate in the First Hug program.**

Walden Class – Room 108

The Walden class is made up of folks of all ages, from young adult to those in their late eighties. From a group such as that you may well imagine the range of perspective the discussions take.
