New Youth Sunday School Classes Beginning TODAY

High School:

The Gospel of John - part 2, Chapters 11-21 (So What? GCP curriculum)

Teacher: Steve Strickland (12 classes)

In this study, we will be guiding students to relate faith to life and life to faith as we listen to the greatest Teacher of all—Jesus, God himself in the flesh. In this eyewitness account written by “the disciple whom Jesus loved,” we find Jesus using everyday items and events to teach deep spiritual truths, and everyone—including teens!—must either believe or reject him. There is no middle ground. We will see just how bold Jesus’ claims were as he demonstrated his divine authority.

Middle School:

Shorter Catechism- Doctrine of Our Great Salvation

Teacher: Danny Dalton (12 classes)

This class is the third installment of our journey through the Westminster Shorter Catechism. We will be studying questions 29-39, which wraps up the first half of the catechism, answering the question, “What is man to believe concerning God?” Students will be challenged to memorize six of these questions (# 30-33, 35, & 37). This class, in particular, looks at our great salvation, from calling us to himself, declaring us righteous, adopting us as his own, making us righteous, and all the benefits Jesus gives his people. Our hope is that this class will help lead our students to worship and be in awe of Jesus!

Knowing God is a book by the British-born Christian theologian J.I. Packer, and is his best-known work, having sold over 1,000,000 copies in North America alone. Originally written as a series of articles for the Evangelical Magazine, it was first published as a book in 1973, and has been reprinted several times. In the book, Packer explores the character of God as revealed in the Bible, and correct Christian responses to it, with chapters on God’s love, grace, majesty, and wrath.
