The Kings and Prophets of Israel

The apostle Paul says in different places you *have been* saved; you *are* being saved; and you *will be* saved. In other words, some aspects of our salvation have been completed already, some are being completed right now, yet the full benefits of our salvation are still in the future. Come and learn what it looks like to live out your Christian life in the here and now, having full assurance of what God has already done and having hope of what God promises to do. This course utilizes New Testament Epistles (aka letters) to cover topics such as freedom from the power of sin, God's sovereignty over our circumstances, the fruit of faith, submission to authority, tithing, assurance of salvation, and the return of Jesus.

High School

Identity and Purpose (So What? GCP curriculum)

If bicycles are designed for cycling and volleyballs are designed for playing volleyball, what are teens designed for? Who are you? Why are you here? What is your purpose? What does it mean that you are created in the image of God? This course uses Genesis 1-3 as a spring board to answer these questions. We will discuss what it means for you to live out your purpose in the context of work, marriage, sexuality, and worship, all in the midst of the hope we have in the gospel despite our brokenness.
