Welcome Reverend Santiago

We welcome Reverend João Alfredo da Cunha Santiago (Jofre) and his wife, Edleia (Leia) to Christ Central Presbyterian Church! Our session has granted them space at CCPC in order to plant the First Presbyterian Church of Tampa Bay (Brazil), a Portuguese speaking church.

Jofre is an ordained minister of the Brazilian Presbyterian Church (the PCA Brazilian counterpart). Since his ordination twenty-six years ago he has pastored and planted numerous churches, while he also served in the Brazilian army. After his retirement, his Presbytery in Mage, Rio de Janeiro state, saw fit to extend its missionary efforts in Tampa Bay. Therefore, he was commissioned as a church planter for Portuguese-speaking peoples, in the Tampa Bay area in 2011. Jofre connected with the Mission to North America Network of Portuguese Speaking Churches, and participates in their annual Church Planting Training Conference, as often as possible.

After two years of adaptation and learning the language, Jofre started his commission in partnership with St. Petersburg Presbyterian Church PCA on February 4, 2014. However, church attendees moved from the area for various reasons. As Jofre and his wife, Leia along with some trusted brothers and sisters prayed for direction, some families on this side of the bay, inquired about the possibility of moving the church to Tampa to give them spiritual assistance. Jofre and Leia visited Tampa area PCA churches, seeking God's will for this ministry and were steered towards Christ Central Presbyterian Church. Jofre's goal is to fulfill the Great Commission here at Christ Central.
