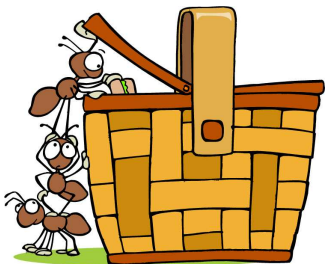
## SPC Family Matters

**First Hug** seeks to stabilize and strengthen homeless families with young children in our immediate community. To make this program a success, MetMin is looking for members of our church to assist in the First Hug program. There are three different ways we can help out with this program:

1. **First Responder** – a First Responder will connect with First Hug families for visitation, prayer, and emotional support. For the most part, this is a short-term commitment per First Hug family. A First Responder will stay in contact with a First Hug family until they are connected with a Family Mentor, generally within 30 -60 days.
2. **Family Mentor** – a Family Mentor provides a minimum 2-year commitment to a First Hug family (only one First Hug family to a Family Mentor at a time), offering support in specific areas of need (money management, parenting, tutoring, etc.), connecting the family to church programs, and visiting with the family. A Family Mentor should be able to commit a minimum of 5 hours per month, with support for the family waning in the second year as the family becomes more self-sufficient.
3. **Parent-Child Home Program** – this is a literacy-school preparedness program for families with 2 & 3 year old children. Volunteers in this program will visit the child in his/her home two times a week for ½ hour, bringing a toy or a book each time. The volunteer models reading to and/or playing with the child with the child's parent present. The program runs for two 23-week cycles over the course of two years.

**Specific program training is provided for each of these different areas. Training and background screening are mandatory for participation in any area of the First Hug program.**

*“When [Jesus] saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, “The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.”*” (Matthew 9:36 – 38) First Hug is a great and unique way to employ the gifts God has blessed each one of us with in assisting families to get back on their feet right here in our community. I am looking for “workers” from our church to participate in one (or more) of the First Hug areas. We need to have a “bull pen” of trained volunteers ready to go when we receive word there is a homeless family in our community who needs our help. **Won't you prayerfully ask the “Lord of the harvest” how you may participate in the First Hug program?**

## *Current Adult Classes*

### **Walden Class – Room 108**

*Teacher: Matthew McKenzie*

The Walden class is made up of folks of all ages, from young adult to those in their late eighties. From a group such as that you may well imagine the range of perspective the discussions take. This class is a Bible study class, open to class discussion, questions, and comments. We study Old Testament as well as New testament books. The length of time (weeks) to complete a Study depends on the class participation and the discussion level generated by a particular text. We do keep a schedule, but are open to the leading of God's Holy Spirit and follow where scripture leads. If this sounds like your kind of Bible study then by all means come and join us. Our worship service is conducive to the study of solid spiritual food, the encouragement to practice what we learn and to follow the leading of Micah 6:8: "To act justly, To love mercy, To walk humbly with our God". “Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last; but we do it to get a crown that will last forever.” (1 Cor 9:24-25) Our class on Spiritual Disciplines will explore how we can better train ourselves to grow in spiritual health and maintain our relationship with Christ and His Church. Join RE Randy Johnson as we explore spiritual disciplines and encourage each other on to win the race.
