The Second Scripture Lesson

The Third Scripture Lesson

12 When Jesus heard that John had been put in prison, he returned to Galilee.
13 Leaving Nazareth, he went and lived in Capernaum, which was by the lake
in the area of Zebulun and Naphtali-- 14 to fulfill what was said through the
prophet Isaiah: 15 "Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali, the way to the sea,
along the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles-- 16 the people living in darkness
have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a
light has dawned." 17 From that time on Jesus began to preach, "Repent, for
the kingdom of heaven is near." 18 As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of

23 Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the good news of the kingdom, and healing every disease and sickness among the people. 24 News about him spread all over Syria, and people brought to him all who were ill with various diseases, those suffering severe pain, the demon-possessed, those having seizures, and the paralyzed, and he healed them. 25 Large crowds from Galilee, the Decapolis, Jerusalem, Judea and the region across the Jordan followed him.

This class will explore the history and meaning of Calvinism.


Under no circumstances will we try to force anyone to accept this view.
