Adult Sunday School Classes Beginning Sept 1

Church History: The First 1,500 Years - Room 14

Teacher: Bryan Toenes

This quarter we will go on a sweeping adventure through a millennium and a half of Christian history starting with the day that a group of devout followers of Jesus were gathered in an upper room waiting patiently for the promised Comforter. Our itinerary includes thirteen stops allowing us a closer look at the men and women whose lives shaped the trajectory of the Christian faith up to the beginning of the Protestant Reformation. Along the way we will encounter martyrs and heretics, emperors and slaves, warriors and monks, scholastics and mystics – people who did their best to contend for the faith once delivered to the saints.

Exploring Genesis - Room 15 Teacher: Brian Waugh

Genesis: a Sunday School class for beginners, or at least a class for people interested in beginnings. The historical narrative of Genesis furnishes the theological explanation for God's activity in the world. This book is packed with action and intrigue from the creation of earth and all things to global flooding to disastrous megaconstruction projects. We will look at journeys to foreign lands with characters of great faith and deep flaws. The power and wisdom of God is expressed throughout this book which brings his people to the point of great blessing, poised to reveal God's majesty and grace in a way only a true prophet could have seen.

Youth Sunday School Classes Beginning Sept 1

High School:

The Five Points of Calvinism Rio Center Teacher: Randy Johnson

This title can be misleading because John Calvin is not the direct author of these five points, nor is Calvinism summed up in five points. Through careful study of sacred Scripture the Synod of Dort offered five counter points to Armenian opposition which came to be known as The Five Points of Calvinism. The specific area of theology covered in these points can be more aptly called God's Sovereignty in Salvation. In this class we will carefully study these five points with the aim to inspire awe, gratitude and new obedience as we realize all the more that salvation is of God.

Middle School:

<u>Shorter Catechism - Doctrine of the Moral Law</u> Rio Center Teacher: Danny Dalton

This class is the fourth installment (of six) in our journey through the Westminster Shorter Catechism. The first three classes asked the question, "What are we to believe?" These final three classes ask, "What does God require of us?" Specifically, this class looks at one of the best known summaries of God's Moral Law, the Ten Commandments. We will be studying questions 39-81. Students will be challenged to memorize three of these questions (41, 42 and 61) as well as Exodus 20:1-17.
